### DIRECTORS' REPORT YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

The Directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2022.

The Society was incorporated on 17 September 2002 and took over the activities of Raith Rovers Independent Association. The Society is a registered society under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014, regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority.

#### **Principal activities**

The Society's objectives are, either itself or through a subsidiary company or society trading for the benefit of the community and acting under its control:

- i) to strengthen the bonds between Raith Rovers Football Club ("the Club") and the community which it serves and to represent the interests of the community in the running of the Club,
- ii) to benefit present and future members of the community served by the Club by promoting, encouraging and furthering the game of football as a recreational facility, sporting activity and focus for community involvement,
- to provide a democratic forum for Society members and the wider community to share and exchange their aspirations for the Club,
- iv) to represent the interests of Society members, and the wider community, in the affairs of the Club and to engage in constructive dialogue with the representatives and staff of the Club,
- v) to support the continuing development of, and widen interest and involvement in, the game of football in the Kirkcaldy area regardless of sex, age, ability or ethnic origin of those involved, and,
- vi) to work to ensure a positive portrayal of football in general, the Club, supporters of the Club and the wider community served by the Club.

## Directors' responsibilities

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Society will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Society and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Society and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### **CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT**

The 2021/22 season began well, with the return of fans to football stadiums following the easing of COVID pandemic restrictions. On the field, we won our third national cup trophy in the Challenge Cup, and enjoyed a great run in the League Cup before losing to Celtic in the quarter finals. We also exited the Scottish Cup in the 5<sup>th</sup> round at the hands of Celtic. In the league, a strong start to the season faltered in December after injuries to key players, eventually leading the club board to authorise the signing of David Goodwillie in an attempt to reverse the team's poor January form.

Our opposition to this signing, alongside many others, contributed to the club's decision not to proceed with the transfer – but as the club had committed to a reported 2 year contract, and paid a transfer fee for his signing, the financial impact of this signing was significant. We engaged extensively and constructively with the club and were keen to help them repair the damage done by the signing, and to ensure that the underlying flaws exposed by the episode were recognised and rectified.

While many called for the resignation of those involved in this transfer, we resisted doing so ourselves. Instead, we have challenged the remaining board members to take responsibility for their part in the transfer by supporting positive change, to make our club better. We are keen to work together towards a long-term sustainable model for the club, with governance and decision-making structures that are fit for purpose and which will prevent any repeat of the recent failures.

We set out four immediate priorities for change:

- 1. Rebuilding trust with the club's volunteers, by demonstrating that the club's values will guide everything that the club does, and that it still stands for the things that led volunteers to devote their time and energy to it in the first place.
- 2. Establishing clear roles and accountabilities at board level, a clearly defined decision-making process, and greater diversity at board level not just in terms of their demographics, but by becoming a leadership group who represent the whole of the community that our football club serves, and put the community at the heart of every decision it makes.
- 3. Ensuring a strong focus on fan engagement, by ensuring permanent democratic representation at board level for supporters. It was notable that our elected Supporter-Director and our Supporter Liaison Officer were the first to resign in protest against the signing of David Goodwillie, and the club must ensure that people with their integrity are listened to the voice of the fans must be taken seriously.
- 4. Extending the existing arrangements for fan engagement to include a permanent 'structured dialogue' process. Building on best practice seen at other Scottish clubs and beyond, Raith Rovers should establish mechanisms to consult with supporters before difficult decisions are made, including a representative group of fans who can be brought into board-level discussions to provide feedback and fresh perspectives. Accountability for decisions should remain with the club's board and staff, but with a checkpoint built into these decisions to ensure they are fully thought through.

Progress on these 'asks' has been limited and slow. The election of Dorothy Wilson as Andy Mill's replacement as Supporter Director took place in April, but it took several months for her to be fully integrated into the club's board. Several other new directors were appointed, but the club's plans for a full review of the board's structure and working arrangements are yet to be seen.

We remain committed to our fundamental purpose – to work together with others for a stronger Raith Rovers. Although the events of January and February have damaged the club's reputation and it's engagement with fans and others in our community, we hope that this can be a turning point for our club, and the impetus for genuine change and improvement.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, I do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the society and the society's members as a body, for my work, for this report, or for the opinions I have formed.

#### Respective responsibilities of Society's Board Members and the examiner

The Society Board Members consider that an audit is not required for this year as an appropriate resolution was approved by members at the last AGM and that an independent examination is therefore appropriate.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts
- follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by Supporters Direct Scotland; and
- state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### **Basis of Independent Examiner's statement**

My examination was carried out in accordance with General Directions given by Supporters Direct Scotland. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the Society and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the Society Board Members concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the accounts.

#### **Independent examiner's statement**

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention

- a) which gives me reasonable cause to believe that, in any material respect, the Society Board Members have not met the requirements to ensure that:
  - i) proper accounting records are kept
  - ii) accounts are prepared which agree with the accounting records and comply with generally accepted accounting requirements; or
- b) to which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

I can also confirm that, in my opinion, the accounts have been properly prepared in accordance with the Cooperative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014.
